OPCAS DATA PRIVACY POLICY

This Privacy Policy ("Policy") outlines how Quezon City Prosecutor's Office ("QCPO," "QC Prosecutor's Office," "We," "Us," or "Our") collects, uses, discloses, and protects personal information in accordance with the Data Privacy Act of 2012 (Republic Act No. 10173) and its implementing rules and regulations (collectively, the "Data Privacy Act").
